Concept 7

The Conference recognizes that the Charter & the Bylaws of General Service Board are legal instruments: that the Trustees are thereby fully empowered to manage and conduct all of the world service affairs of A.A. It is further understood that the Conference Charter itself is not a legal document: that it relies instead upon the force of tradition and the power of the A.A. purse for its final effectiveness.

The practical power of the Conference will nearly always be superior to the legal power of the Trustees.
